NOTICE OF RACE

OPEN TO MEMBERS OF ANY YACHT CLUB

1. RULES:

- 1.1 The series will be governed by the 'current rules' as defined in "The *Racing Rules of Sailing* 2021-2024."
- 1.2 The YNZ Safety Regulations shall apply. - Keel Boats - Part II Category 5.
- 1.3 In accordance with YNZ Safety Regulations Part II 3.2, a declaration of safety compliance will be required in the entry form. Random inspections may be undertaken.
- 1.4 Conditions of Marlborough District Council Harbour Bylaws (Safety around large vessels)

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY:

- 2.1 The series is open to all Farr 1020 Keelboats that are skippered by a current member of the Farr 1020 Association.
- 2.2 Farr 1020 Class Rules shall apply except where dispensation has been approved by the Farr 1020 committee in writing.
 - 2.2.1 The use of furling headsails is permitted provide the sail fits within the class rules.
- 2.3 Entries will be accepted until 2359hrs **Friday 7th April 2023** by completing an online entry at waikawaboatingclub.co.nz or emailing events@waikawaboatingclub.co.nz and paying an entry fee of \$120.00. (Covers the cost of prizes and running the event)
- 2.4 Entries received after the closing date will incur a **\$50 late fee**.
- 2.5 To be eligible to complete in this series each skipper shall be a financial member of a club recognised by the skipper's national authority.
- 2.6 A minimum of 4 (four) boats must be entered before 2359hrs Friday 7th April 2023 for the series to be run otherwise any entry fees received will be refunded.
- 2.7 Boats can select to enter in the open or handicap divisions (or both) which will all be run as a single division, but handicapping adjustments will be made for boats that select handicap. These handicaps may be changed during the Championship.
- 2.8 New Sails must be signed off by the class appointed measurer, sails that are older than 2 years can be declared class legal but must be presented for measuring at the end of racing if a protest is lodged over sail eligibility.
- 2.9 Each yacht shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$2,000,000 per event. Evidence of insurance shall be provided by 2359hrs Friday 7th April 2023. The WBC Organising Authority encourages all owners to carry full racing insurance.

4. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS:

The Sailing Instructions for the 2023 Farr 1020 Central Island Champs will be available by request at events@waikawaboatingclub.co.nz closer to the date. This event is planned to run in conjunction with the Waikawa Boating Club Easter Regatta, Although a separate start for the Farr 1020 championship will be planned, it may be necessary for time/weather reasons to have combined start with the regatta boats. Results will be extracted.

5. RACING AREA:

The races will be held in the area will be QCS Inner Harbour Area. Course charts will be provided for harbour races.

6. COURSES TO BE SAILED:

The courses will be eight (8) in total 6x Windward/Leeward Courses and 2 x Harbour Races.

7. SCORING:

7.1 The Low Points Scoring System, Appendix A will apply.

7.2 Three (3) races will be required to be completed to constitute a series.

7.3 (a) When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

7.4 (b) When six to seven races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score. When 8 races have been completed each yachts score will be excluding her two worst results.

8. PRIZES:

The Farr 1020 Central Island Championship cups will be presented for first online and first on Handicap plus prizes as determined by entries at the prizegiving.

Prize giving will be approximately 90 minutes after last finishes on Sunday, and be held at the WBC clubrooms.

9. Disclaimer of Liability

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
